Question was raised by Ann B regarding assigned tables at lunch and if any change was coming. There are a number of children who feel they are stuck at a table without the ability to change seats or change without the stigma of being the one who tattled. The kids thought they would switch at beginning of Quarter 2 but apparently that didn't happen for seventh grade. Mr. Wolfson did explain that this practice was something that was noted in best practices and he has significantly fewer children in the office upset over lunch trauma since the installation of assigned tables. The kids do have the ability to switch but need to talk to a lunch monitor about it. Some parents expressed an appreciation for it since it negates the stress of finding a spot every day. Mr. Wolfson will bring it up in a quarterly staff meeting to discuss concerns since he was unsure of the actual details of the 7<sup>th</sup> grade switch but said that was the original plan and he believes that 6<sup>th</sup> grade did switch. Another concern was voiced about

how social emotional learning is going to happen and how it will be pushed to the HS level.
